

LETTER FROM OUR LEADERS

DEAR CAMP FIRE FAMILY,

What a year it has been! Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah celebrated 100 years of serving campers in 2021. Our Staff and Board of Directors have worked hard to overcome many challenges over the past year, and we are proud to share about all that we have accomplished .

The Extended Day program at Good Shepherd Montessori was able to operate throughout the 2020-2021 school year. We had 54 registered students, and served an average of 11 students each day after school. We also provided two weeks of day camp programming at GSMS in December, when the school switched to virtual learning between the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. At the start of the 2021-2022 school year, we have been serving an average of 18 students each afternoon.

The After School program at Sam Adams Elementary was not active for the 2020-2021 school year, but resumed in August 2021 with before and after school care for the 2021-2022 school year. We have an average of 27 students each morning before school, 11 students each afternoon.

Our summer camp program at Camp Tannadoonah served a record 1111 campers in the summer of 2021! We provided a full schedule with 8.5 weeks of overnight and day camp sessions. The availability of a COVID vaccine for adults and our older youth, as well as rapid testing upon arrival at camp allowed us to have a succesful summer with no community tranmission of COVID at camp.

Our staff worked hard to seek out numerous avenues for funding, allowing us to recover much of the financial losses we incurred last year. We received a second PPP loan, Employee Retention Tax Credits, and grants from the State of Michigan, the Southwest Michigan First Foundation, Camp Fire National Headquarters, Becton Dickinson, United Way of St. Joseph County, and many donations from individuals.

In September, we celebrated our 100th Anniversary with a wonderful Centennial Celebration at Camp Tannadoonah. Approximately 70 people joined us for the event, some staying the weekend at camp, and others attending as "day campers" on Saturday. All those in attendance agreed that we should make Grown Up Camp an annual event!

It was a year full of change and challenge for our year-round staff! We said goodbye to Jess Barron, our registrar, in June; Mike Sposato, the Camp Ranger, in August; and Adam Lucassian, our Camp Director, in September, as they moved on to other positions. We announced Gabby Bittner as our new Camp Director for Camp Tannadoonah at the Centennial event in September.

Sharon Hayward and Andrew Roche will be completing their terms on the Board at this year's annual meeting. Both Sharon and Andrew joined the Board in October 2014. Sharon served as Secretary, and then two terrms as President during her tenure on the Board. Andrew also served as Secretary, then Vice President, and also chaired the Strategic Facilities Committee. John Michel will be completing his service as the Treasurer at this year's annual meeting, though he will continue to serve as an at large member of the Board of Directors. We are very grateful for Sharon, Andrew, and John's years of dedication to Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah!

Our major project of the year was the restoration of Morris Lodge. During the past year, we completed the rewiring of all of the electrical in Morris, installed new light fixtures, finished the interior walls with pine carsiding, and installed a gas insert in the fireplace. The beautiful fireplace is useable again for the first time in 30 years! This project is nearly completed, and we plan to finish the few remaining components this winter.

Thank you to all of our donors, volunteers, and staff members for your generosity and steadfast support in making all this possible, and for your shared passion for helping our Camp Fire youth find their Sparks. We are excited about what we can achieve together we look ahead to the next 100 years at Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah!

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Financial information presented here is based on the unaudited financial statements for the year ended September 30, 2021. The complete financial statements have been determined to represent fairly, in all material aspects, the financial position of Camp Fire River Bend as of September 30, 2021, and the changes in its net assets and its cash flows for the year in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

For regular income and expense, the program-related functional expenses represented 78% of the fiscal year expenses, while the expenses for fundraising, online store, and administration represented just 22% of the fiscal year expenses. The council spent \$68,188 on facilities improvement projects, program equipment upgrades (including 2 new boats for waterskiing at camp), and new marketing assets.

We were only able to operate one of our two after school programs during the 2020-2021 school year, but we're excited to be back in action at both schools this year. Camp Tannadoonah served a record number of 1111 campers this summer!
